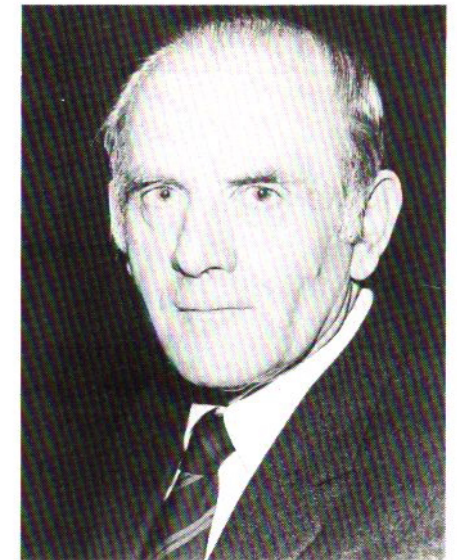



This is the fifth time that International women squash players have met to compete for the title, "Women's World Squash Champion." Since the first meeting in Brisbane, 1976, the game for women and girls at World level has developed, brought about by the introduction of team, junior (under-19) and senior (over-40) Championship events at subsequent meetings.
