










## A moment with Paul Assaiante



Paul Assaiante, two-time olympic coach-of-the-year, professional speaker and author, world championship coach and the "winningest coach in college sports history", has motivated top athletes from around the world. Currently the Trinity College head men's squash coach in Hartford, Connecticut, and the US Squash head national coach he recently helped guide the United States squash team to unprecedented success on the biggest international stage at the 2019 pan american games in

Lima, Peru this July 25 to 31. Team USA won both the men's and women's team gold medals and claimed a record total five golds, one silver and one bronze medal at the quadrennial event.

We asked Paul a couple of questions about what it all meant to him:

## What are your hopes for the future of team USA and US Squash?

Things are about to change dramatically for US Squash as the us national training center will be up and running by the fall of 2020. This could truly be a game changer for us as it will become the home for all US Squash constituenties and will be the "apirational center"! Our young ones will be able to work and learn side by side next to our top players.

What distinguishes a US Squash player from other nationalities. Is there a US Squash style of play, actually there is no discernable us style, particularly as so many of our players are now being coached by world class international coaches, many of whom have moved now moved to the States.

One thing we truly are focused on however is the development of character through sport and we hope the center will be a beacon for this!

Best moments about being team USA coach: to be frank, this summer at the Pan American games was astounding. To watch our men and women stand on the podium as they accepted their hard earned gold medals (5 of them) made me so very happy for them.

## How and when did you get seriously interested in squash?

Funny story but I was made the head coach of squash at West Point having never seen a court before. I am an example of "fake it until you make it".

## What would you say is your unique style of coaching and what are you looking for in a player?

Character! First and foremost. Competition makes you uncomfortable and one needs to learn to be comfortable in states of discomfort. To do this, one must be "character large".

## What are your best memories in coaching?

Our Trinity team losing in the finals of the national championships to Princeton! Seeing our men genuinely gutted bythis result made me proud of them because they truly went "all in". How many people in life ever experience that level of commitment? It was also my friend Bob Callahans last match at Princeton and it thrilled me that he went out a winner

## What is your essential coaching philosophy?

To be a great coach (and leader in any industry) you must be an empath. You must be able to put yourself in the other persons shoes to be able to truly understand where they are coming from. It is not about you, but about them and so this must always be the starting point.

## What's next for you?

I just hope I can continue making a small impact on the game. I have gotten more from it, than it has gotten from me.





## The General Returns.

On Thursday October 11, 2018, egendary Frenchman Gregory Gaultier limped off court at the J.S. Open following an epic five-game, 74-minute battle with Egypt's then-World No.2 Ali Farag. It transpired after the tournament that Gaultier had in fact been playing with a broken kneecap and the enigmatic Frenchman has not stepped on court since in a professional tournament.

The former World No.1 will make his eagerly anticipated comeback as part of the French team when the Men's World Team Squash Championship takes place in Washington D.C. this week – bringing an end to a gruelling 13-month rehabilitation period punctuated with numerous surgeries and setbacks.

"I'm very thankful to all my team who did a wonderful job and always believed there was a solution, so I just didn't give up.

"I had my second surgery on May 15, and I had to stay on crutches for eight or nine weeks because when I was at the U.S. Open, I was playing through pain. I didn't know what I had exactly, I thought it was just inflammation, but I couldn't even walk up the stairs to the glass court, I had to take the elevator.

"I left the day after the quarterfinal, had an MRI, and one piece of cartilage and bone was broken [in his knee]. The next day I had surgery in Czech Republic, and the cartilage that they inserted into the bone didn't really heal well."

Gaultier admits the rehabilitation process has been a tough one, while he even had to re-learn how to walk again, leading him to debate whether he would be able to return to playing squash.

"There was the possibility of not being able to play squash again or do any sports".


The 'French General' is one of the sport's greatest ever players and has helped France to silver medals at the World Teams in both 2003 and 2009. He has won 40 professional titles in addition to topping the PSA World Rankings on six separate occasions, with the last of those seeing him become the sport's oldest ever World No.1. Gaultier made his first appearance since the 2018 U.S. Open in a French League match at his home club, Annecy, in November.

He will line-up alongside World No.15 Gregoire Marche, former World No.6 Mathieu Castagnet and World No.45 Baptiste Masotti in the American capital as they look to challenge for the prestigious title.

"I'm glad to start by making the World Teams with France. It will be another experience in my life, a new start and I'm happy to try to help my teammates as much as possible.


World No.7 to his current ranking of World No.622. However, Epinal-born Gaultier will still be one of the star attractions in Washington D.C. and is relishing making his return to competitive action after a lengthy spell on the sidelines.

"I can't wait to start again... I'm not putting any pressure on myself, I just want to enjoy and will see how the improvement goes throughout the season".





# THE UNITED STATES OF SQUASH

In November the Howe Cup came to a close and for only the fifth time in its 91-year history, a west coast team won the championship. Before this unlikely accomplishment in a day 2 match, Melliah Santos from the SquashSmarts program won a crucial game over Seattle's #1. And in the 2019 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru, Team USA earned gold medals in both the men's and women's team events, both doubles events, and the women's singles. These impressive results suggest that change is afoot in the United States of Squash.

Over a decade ago, US Squash, the Professional Squash Association, and notable organizations and individuals began to spearhead the adoption of the game within the United States. As 2020 approaches and 1.7 million players compete around the country the consequences of their efforts can be felt like the aftershocks from an earthquake. Squash Education Alliance, a massive organization supporting youth engagement has built programs in 20+ cities causing a tectonic shift in stars to the sport (Melliah Santos comes from an affiliate program). East coast youth tournament registration has skyrocketed almost 500% since 2012 and more schools have built teams as a result. In the 2015 men's

national championship, two non-Ivy League Schools competed against each other for the first time in history; in fact they were Division III schools. Along with the introduction of more school teams has come more opportunity for strong coaches to move to the United States like Thierry Lincou, John White, and David Palmer; all former world number ones. And like past explorers, squash has forged paths from its east coast roots to over the midwestern appalachian mountains and into the western rockies. The Eastbanc Group commissioned the building of America's first pay-to-play facility in Virginia, finance giant Mark Walter brought the World Championships to his hometown of Chicago offering the first \$1 million dollar prize fund in history, and former world number nine Adrian Grant emigrated to Los Angeles to grow the UCLA program. The efforts of these squash pioneers goes mostly unnoticed but like flowers in a yard, you don't notice until they bloom.

In the late 1960s, the televised Open Era introduced fans to a new side of Tennis. But that overnight success began decades earlier on the nation's public



courts where eager young players could access the sport. Once the Grand Slams were opened to these professionals, their raw personalities connected deeply with the American public. American tennis fans found someone to root for because they had skin in the game; homegrown players represent the tapestry that is the American sports fan.

The efforts of these squash pioneers goes mostly unnoticed but like flowers in a yard, you don't notice until they bloom.

We are at the precipice of this in squash. The work accomplished in the past few decades has paved roads for unlikely athletes to adopt and triumph in a traditionally expensive sport in all corners of our country, reach the pinnacle of NCAA athletics, receive top-tier education, join the professional tour, and live off their earnings. Representing 30% of a \$600B market, the United States is the sporting equivalent of a Roman Emperor. And right now squash stands on the arena floor of the colosseum before a crowd of 1.7 million players, awaiting the Emperor's decision on whether the sport lives or dies. And the Emperor's thumb just went up. ■
