











Message of Welcome from the Prime Minister Mr. Bob Hawke

It is encouraging to know that this year's championships will also feature for the first time — the World Junior Title.





We hope that players, officials and spectators will all contribute to the success of the matches and to the enjoyment of everyone. Squash is a fine game, let us demonstrate this to the world.





RHONDA THORNE



She has reached the quarter finals and semis in many events — the Scottish, British, Irish, New Zealand and Australian Opens. She is representing her country for the first time as a senior. Carin is 22 years old and is single.

JAN MILLER

Jan plays for the Modbury Club in South Australia. She is 26 years old and married. Jan is a qualified accountant who recently resigned her position to concentrate on her squash career. Jan is a relative newcomer to squash, starting at the age of 20 showing a meteoric rise to the top in only six years, but has lived in the shadow of her compatriot Vicki Cardwell. She toured overseas this year and played in the British Open, the Essex and the Swiss Open, being knocked out in each event by a fellow Australian. She did however win the Bridge of Allan Open in Scotland. She is wearing a green and gold blazer for the first time.

Age 20, English ranking No. 1. Over the last four years LIsa has made a tremendous impact on the women's game of squash in England. Although still a junior, she began winning senior titles in 1979 and by 1981 had earned herself a place in the England team. By October 1981 Lisa was improving at such a rate that she gained fourth place in the World Championships, and won the World Junior Invitation as well as representing England at No. 2 string. To date LIsa has gained 18 international caps and currently holds the British under 23 open title.

MARTINE LE MOIGNAN

Age 21, English ranking No. 2. At the last World Championships in 1981, Martine came sixth and was a member of the England team competing in the Team Championship. On her return to England in the same year she brought the season to a peak by winning the British under 23 Open and reaching the final of the British Closed. With perhaps the most deceptive style amongst the current women players, Martine is an advanturous player who delights in stroke play. She has represented England on 21 occasions and her considerable talent will bring her many further honours.

RUTH STRAUSS

Ruth's remarkable racket skills enable her to hit winners from any part of the court. She has had a most distinguished junior career — first winning the British under-19 open at the age of 24, and regaining the title for a second time in 1981. In the same year Ruth came third in the World junior championship, and last season she achieved third place in the Just Juice British closed championship.

ANGELA SMITH

Age 30, English ranking No. 3. Angela won her first national title in 1975 precipitating a spectacular rise through the national rankings. Since then she has collected an impressive string of major titles and also has the consistent ability to reserve her best form for the big occasion. Angela currently holds a prime coaching post in Nassau in the Bahamas and she is very much the senior player in the team. She has played in the England team at both World Team Championships held to date — in 1979 she played at No. 2 and in 1981 at No. 1 — and her total number of representative appearances number 19 for England and seven for Great Britain.

BARBARA DIGGENS



ANNE SMITH



DOROTHY SHARP (Manager)


Dorothy Sharp is married with a year old son. Distinguished international career from 1963-1980 holding a record number of 65 caps. A full time coach in Edinburgh.

She represented New Zealand as a junior in 1974 and 1975 and as a senior in 1979, 1980 and 1981. After a surprising loss to Susan Devoy in the 1981 semi-finals at North Shore, her game developed remarkably. After being ranked 8th in the World in 1981 she is now in No. 3 position which is the highest ranking for any New Zealand squash player ever. She dominated the New Zealand scene in 1982 winning every event including her first national title. In the last two years she has defeated virtually every world ranked player apart from the current No. 1 Vicki Cardwell.

She is a very graceful mover around the court and is particularly strong on the backhand, with her all court game and consistency as other attributes.

SUSAN DEVOY

From the Hamilton Squash Club, Hamilton, aged 19 years, professional squash player.

Current New Zealand junior open champion and previous winner of under 13, 15 and 17 National titles and has also won the 1980 Queensland junior and 1981 under 23 championships. She represented New Zealand in the 1981 World Championships where she reached the junior semi-final and she subsequently competed in Europe. Lost in the 1982 Adidas and National finals she then again played the European season where she made a significant advance reaching the quarter-finals of the British Open as well as gaining many other successes, and as a result of her performances is now ranked No. 10 in the world and will undoubtedly make further advances. 

Rules for team events

At least 24 hours before the start of the first match of the championship each team shall lodge in a sealed envelope with the adjudicator(s) the names of all players in the team, in descending order of strength. Where a team has four or more playing members, the order of strength lodged shall cover all players.

The order shall be adhered to throughout the championship, subject to a requested change in the order being substantiated to the satisfaction of the adjudicator(s).

The teams shall be declared 24 hours before the first match. For subsequent matches, the teams will be declared within one hour of completion of play of the previous round. Immediately after the declaration of teams the order of play shall be regulated by the toss of a coin. The winner of the toss shall elect which tie shall be played first. The loser of the toss shall elect which tie shall be played second. The third tie will follow. Further substitution may only be allowed with the approval of the adjudicator(s).

One point shall be awarded to the winning team in each match. In the event of a tie for any position in the final result table, the team which won the most individual ties shall be placed above the other tied teams. In the event of the teams concerned having won the same number of ties, the team which won the most games shall be placed above the other tied teams. In event of a tie in games won, the teams concerned shall play off.
